



2010 USTA Jr. Team Tennis Kentucky State Championships 10U QuickStart Tennis Format

Court size: 60' x 27'

Racket size: 25" or smaller

Ball: Wilson Orange Low Compression

Serves: Overhead and underhand serves are allowed. Drop hits are not allowed.

Team Match: A team match will include 2 singles and 1 doubles match. Matches are not gender specific.

Scoring: All matches on 60' modified courts are best of two (2) short sets to four (4) games, with no-ad scoring. At three (3) games all in a set, a regular no-ad game will be played.

If the players split sets, a first to seven (7) point game will be played in place of a third set. A team scores one (1) point for every game won.

The maximum number of points a player can win is eight (8) points.

The maximum number of points a team can win is forty (40) points per dual match.

Dual team matches can end in a tie.

NO-AD Scoring: The first team or player to win four points wins the game. If the score reaches three points all, the receiver has a choice of receiving in the ad or deuce court. The winner of the next point wins the game.

- **In singles**, the receiver may choose to receive on either the left or right side of the court at 3-3 in the game.
- **In doubles**, the receiving team has a choice of who will receive the last point at 3-3 in the game. Both players must remain on the same receiving side they have played on during the match.
- **In mixed doubles**, the boy must receive serve from the boy, and the girl must receive serve from the girl at 3-3 in the game.

Service order for the third set: Next player/team in order will start service for the third set (7 point game). One player serves a point from the right side (deuce) and then the left side (ad). After that, the opponent does the same. Continue until someone gets to seven (7) points to win the set.

Court Monitors: Matches will have a court monitor for every two courts of play. Court monitors are simply responsible for ensuring that matches proceed without hitches – that the server alternates courts, that they do not play ad points, that they do call the score correctly, etc. They are not "officials" and do not insert themselves into the matches except to assist as described. Court monitors will be adult volunteers selected by tournament staff. Parents from all QuickStart teams are expected to serve in this capacity if so asked by tournament staff.
