

USTA LEAGUE

MAJOR REGULATION CHANGES FOR 2012

1.04E(1) Domicile and Residency Requirements.

Any individual who competes in the USTA League must be domiciled within the boundaries of a USTA Section Association (or participate through a USTA direct Member Club). Residents of foreign countries who meet membership and age requirements may be invited by a USTA Section to participate in the program provided that all such matches are played within the Section. Sections may create residency requirement rules to encourage and foster local league play.

2.01A Levels of Play. USTA League levels are in accordance with the following table:

In mixed league there is an option to play 2.5 straight level in addition to the combined levels. Using straight NTRP level, players cannot have a rating higher than the NTRP level in which they are competing. Using combined NTRP level, the combined NTRP level of the doubles team cannot exceed the combined NTRP ratings level entered. The NTRP difference between members of an individual doubles team may not exceed 1.0

Regardless of any other regulation, a league coordinator, a member of the Championships Committee, a Grievance Committee, or a Grievance Appeal Committee, may file a grievance at any time except for an NTRP Grievance.
